"Trauma and Root Resorption"



Dr. Leif Bakland is a 1963 graduate of the School of Dentistry, Loma Linda University . He received his Endodontic degree from Harvard School of Dental Medicine. Dr. Bakland has been involved in education, research, publications and professional organizations for over 40 years. His research and publication interests include endodontics and dental trauma. Dr. Bakland has been active in service to organized dentistry by holding many leadership positions in the AAE, ABE, COD, and the International Association of Dental Truama. Dr. Bakland has been Associate Editor of the *Journal of Endodontics* and currently serves on the Editorial Board of *Dental Traumatology* and is Co-Editor of <u>Traumatic</u> <u>Dental Injuries</u> and Ingle's <u>Endodontics</u>.

Dr. Johnson is Director of Postdoctoral Endodontics at the University of Illinois in Chicago. He has published clinical and research articles in many scientific journals and is coauthor of the chapters *Periradicular Surgery* (<u>Pathways of the Pulp</u>) and *Management Considerations for the Medically Complex Endodontic Patient* (Ingle's <u>Endodontics</u>) Dr. Johnson has served on the AAE Research and Scientific Affairs Committee and Evidence Based Endodontics Committee. Dr. Keith Krell currently maintains a full-time private practice in West Des Moines, IA. He is an adjunct professor at the University of Iowa College of Dentistry. Dr. Krell received his D.D.S. and M.S. degrees from the University of Iowa and an M.A. is sociology-anthropology from the USIU in San Diego, CA. Dr. Jeremy Mao D.D.S.,, Ph.D. is currently Professor at Columbia College of Dental Medicine and Director of Craniofacial Regeneration Center at Columbia University Medical Center. Dr. Mao has published over 200 scientific papers, conference proceedings and book chapters in the area of tissue engineering, stem cells and regenerative medicine. He currently serves on the editorial board of many international scientific journals including *Tissue Engineering, Stem Cells and Therapeutics, Journal of Biomedical Material Research, International Journal of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery*, and *Journal of Endodontics*. Dr. Mao is the editor of a new book entitled <u>Translational Approaches in Tissue Engineering and Regenerative Medicine</u> and the upcoming textbook entitled <u>Principles of Craniofacial Growth and Development</u>. Dr. Mao is an internationally recognized pioneer in the field of stem cell-based dental, oral and craniofacial regeneration.



"Microbiology of Endodontic Disease"

Dr. Christine Sedgley received her BDS, MDS, MDSc (Endodontics), FRACDS, and MRACDS (Endodontics) in Australia , her PH.D. in Oral Microbiology at the University of Hong Kong and her Advanced Specialty Certificate in Endodontics from the University of Michigan. Dr. Sedgley is Assistant Professor in Endodontics at the University of Michigan. She has published over 50 papers and abstracts, participated in more than 75 continuing education and research presentations and authored the *Microbial Virulence* chapter in the <u>Endodontic Microbiology</u> textbook and co-authored the *Endodontic Microbiology* chapter in Ingle's <u>Endodontics</u>. Dr. Sedgley is on the editorial board/scientific board of several journals including *Journal of Endodontics, International Endodontic Journal* and the *Australian Endodontic Journal*.
